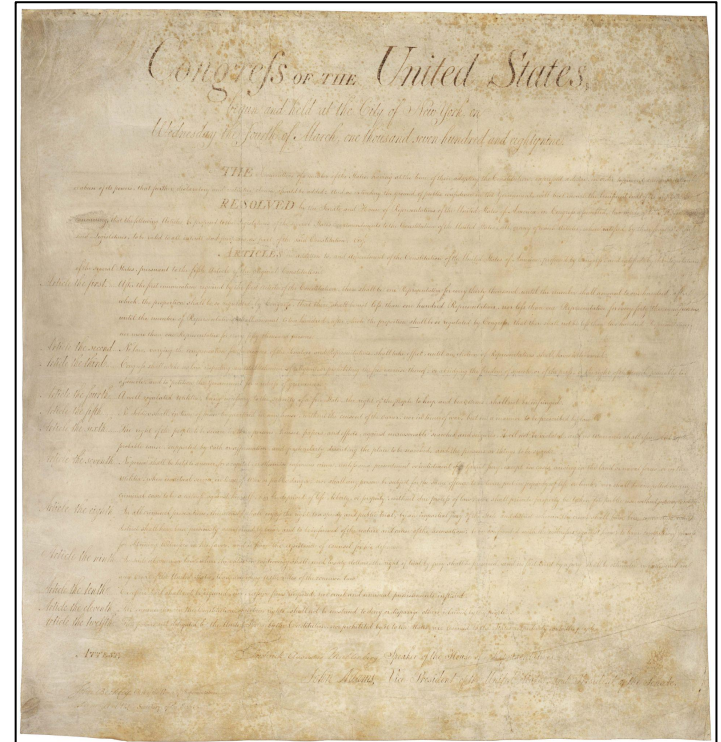
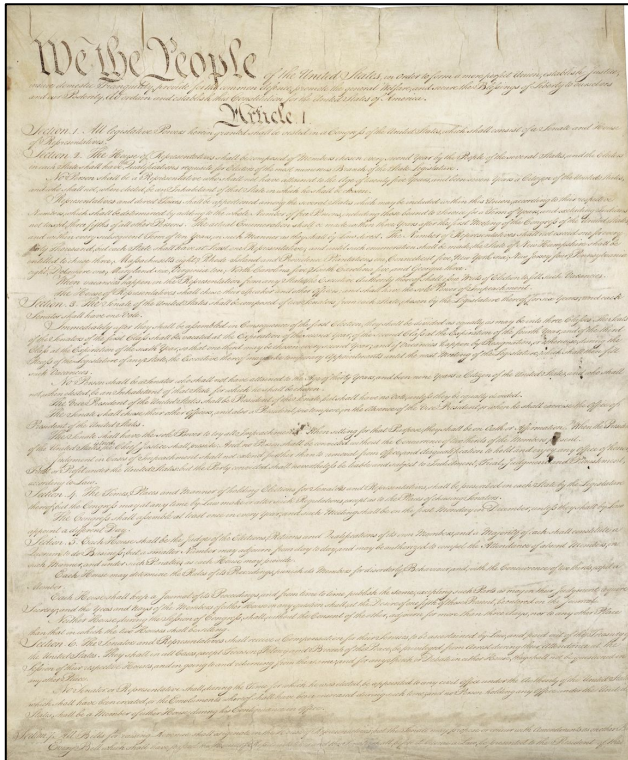

You can contact officials to share your opinions on how the government is working.

Freedom of Religion



You are free to make your own choices about religion. The government won't choose for you.
