

First Grade: Civics at Home



Developing enlightened and responsible citizens is a team effort between the home and school. To support student civic learning at home, the following suggestions are designed for students and their families to explore the civic world together.













RULES & LAWS

- Check out or download books that relate to rules and laws.
- Engage in conversations about rules students follow at home. school, and within the community.
- Reinforce what rules are and why we have them.
- Point out examples of laws in the community as you drive around (e.g., stop signs, traffic lights, speed limits, crosswalks, etc.)
- Identify differences between rules and laws.
- Look at the U.S. Constitution and Florida Constitution together and focus on the first three words of each preamble.



RESPONSIBLE CITIZENS

- Talk about the differences between rights and responsibilities.
- Complete a public service project together.
- Look for examples of responsible citizens.
- Engage in conversations about characteristics of irresponsible citizens.
- Practice responsible ways to make decisions (e.g., voting, taking turns, sharing, listening to other perspectives, etc.).

PATRIOTISM & SYMBOLS

- Listen to the National Anthem together.
- Discuss times and places you have heard the National Anthem played.
- Recognize the governor of Florida.
- Look for places the national or state motto are displayed ("In God We Trust").
- Learn about the different ways to respect the American flag.
