GOVERNMENT

- Explore different careers available within the three branches of government at a local, state, and national level.
- Look up your local state senator and state representatives.
- · Review the three branches of government as they pertain to Florida's state government.
- Read more about Florida's Constitution.



RESPONSIBLE CITIZENS

- Attend or watch a public meeting or government meeting.
- Write a letter to one of your representatives about a topic important to your family.
- Identify a public issue and who is responsible for addressing it (e.g., roads, zoning, etc.)
- Volunteer your time with a local organization.
- Take your student to vote with you during election years and discuss the importance of this civic duty.
- Show a random act of kindness. for someone who works in a public service position (e.g., law enforcement, healthcare, education, military, etc.)

- Learn more about the elected officials in your district.
- Involve yourself in the laws and changes happening at the state level by tracking a bill in current legislation.
