# Third Grade: Civics at Home

Developing enlightened and responsible citizens is a team effort between the home and school. To support student civic learning at home, the following suggestions are designed for students and their families to explore the civic world together.



#### GOVERNMENT

- Point out examples of local. state, and national levels of government responsibilities.
- Identify the buildings of the local and state executive, judicial, and legislative branches.
- Draw a diagram of how the state and national government is organized.
- List a variety of government services.
- Discuss why you think the words "We the People" appear in the national and state constitution and what you think they mean.

#### RESPONSIBLE **CITIZENS**

- Practice identifying and embodying various civic virtues (e.g., courage, fairness, compassion, self-discipline, tolerance, wisdom, contributions, humility, integrity, juice, respect, responsibility, etc.)
- Participate in acts of cooperation and civility (e.g., book drives, food drives, community clean-ups, blood drives, being a good neighbor)
- Write thank you letters to community helpers.
- Take your student to vote with you during election years and discuss the importance of this civic duty.



### **PATRIOTISM & SYMBOLS**

- Take virtual field trips to historical locations throughout the U.S.
- Look for locations that feature the Great Seal of Florida.
- Examine the Declaration of Rights in the Florida Constitution.
- View Howard Chandler Christv's painting Signing of the Constitution.
